- VI. **Essay:** For one of the organizations you listed under IV, Community Service, please write a short essay (less than 500 words) about your experience with the organization. For example: (1) Why did you chose this organization for your community service? (2) How has your experience with this organization has affected your life? or (3) What skills did you learn and how will they help you be successful as you move forward in life?

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- VII. **Transcript and references:** Please also submit your transcript and references specified below. Please note they may be sent either via mail or electronically and they may be submitted separately from your typed application as long as they also arrive by the January 25, 2019, deadline.
- A. A copy of your official high school transcript; and
  - B. Two letters of reference from the adults specified below with contact information (email or telephone). Each letter should focus on personal attributes that are indicators of your character, leadership qualities, future success, and commitment to community service.
    - 1. Letter one: A core academic teacher (i.e. English, Foreign Language, Math, Science, or Social Studies).
    - 2. Letter two: Any other adult who is not related to you and knows you well. For example, a non-core teacher (Art or Music); a coach; a teacher from an outside activity such as dance, martial arts, etc.; an employer; a community service mentor; or similar individuals.
